
* Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

* Grow a bean plant (in school) and keep a bean diary. We will be drawing and describing the changes that we notice each week.

Music Express units of work: 'Weather' and 'Pattern'.


* Pupils use their voices expressively and creatively by singing a song and speaking a chant.
