

Topic: Oh, I do like to be beside the seaside!

Science

Animals, including Humans

Living things and their habitats

- * Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.
- * Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited (investigate sea creatures and underwater plants).

Music

Music Express unit of work 'Water'.

- * Understanding pitch through singing, movement and note names.
- * Performing a melody
- * Understanding melody through songs, movement and performing pitch shapes on tuned instruments.
- * Exploring and developing an understanding of pitch
- * Using musical scales, high notes and low notes in a composition

Geography

Physical features including: beach, cliff, coast, sea, season and weather.

Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.

Local study: compare and contrast the physical and human features that the village of Uffington has to the seaside town of Hunstanton.
