#### Pupil Premium Report – July 2023



#### **Our Vision**

We are a family-orientated school where everyone is welcome, a place where we strive to provide the best possible education in a caring Christian environment; an education that allows everyone to flourish and have the confidence to make a positive contribution. We seek to develop the individual strengths of everyone within our school community, where each unique personality can be recognised and valued.

Our Christian values underpin everything we do: Thankfulness, Kindness, Forgiveness, Fairness, Friendship, Trust, Hope and Inclusion are key priorities for all pupils and adults in our school.

At Uffington School we endeavour to support all our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required.

Children of families serving in HM Forces, Looked After Children and children eligible for Free School Meals attract the Pupil Premium. Children who have ever been eligible for Free School Meals continue to attract the Pupil Premium under the 'Ever 6' ruling; the reason for this is that, as a group, children who have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in time have consistently lower educational attainment than those who have never been eligible for Free School Meals. The Government believes that the Pupil Premium is the best way to address the current inequalities by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who most need it.

At Uffington School, we endeavour to encourage all those families who are eligible for Free School Meals to register, even if they do not wish to take a meal provided by the school, in order to release the funding to which they are entitled.

The Pupil Premium is currently set at £1,455 for children eligible for Free School Meals at the present time or who have been eligible within the past six years. The school receives a further £335 for the children of service personnel and £2,530 for Previously Looked-After Children.

It is the responsibility of governing bodies to monitor how the Pupil Premium is used to improve outcomes for children in these groups.

The governors of Uffington Church of England Primary School have made the decision to utilise Pupil Premium funding as follows:

- To provide additional small group teaching in English and Mathematics;
- To support learning through the provision of teaching assistants;
- To provide specialist counselling, e.g. play therapy;
- To fund, in full, any costs relating to extra-curricular activities and visits, including residential trips.

The Headteacher and Governing Body monitor the attainment progress of children eligible for the Pupil Premium on a regular basis in order to assess the impact of funding.

#### Outcomes for Children in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding 2022 / 2023

In 2023, there were two children eligible for end of key stage assessment (Years 2 and 6); the child in KS1 met the expected standard in Reading and Mathematics; the child in KS2 achieved the expected standard in Reading. A child who was assessed using the Year 1 Phonics Screening test has not yet met the required standard.
